Maintenance bills straining Ilorin Central Mosque, BoT cries out

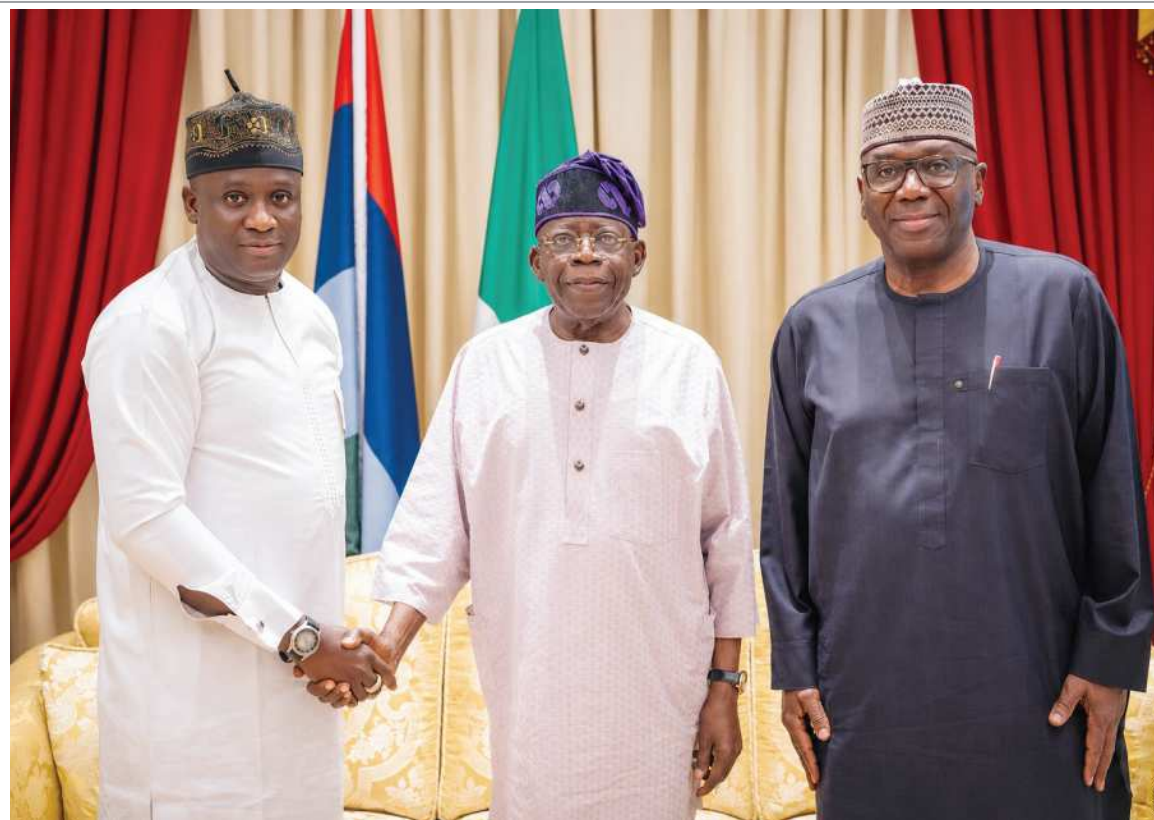

The Board of Trustees (BoT) of the Ilorin Central Juma'at Mosque has appealed for renewed financial support from stakeholders to sustain the upkeep and development of the historic religious edifice.

The trustees disclosed that the mosque requires approximately N5.5 million monthly for recurrent expenditure, amid inflationary pressures.

Its secretary, Alhaji Shehu AbdulGafar, raised the concerns over the increasing cost of maintaining the iconic edifice while presenting a progress report during the 2025/2026 annual joint meeting of the Board of

ADC crisis: Court to hear Bala-Gombe's suit against Mark, Aregbesola Wednesday

Justice Peter Lifu of the Federal High Court in Abuja has fixed June 3 for hearing in a suit filed by Nafiu-Bala Gombe, seeking to stop David Mark and others from parading themselves as leaders of the African Democratic Congress (ADC).

The News Agency of Nigeria

(NAN) reports that hearing notices have since been issued and served on lawyers to the parties in the suit.

One of the lawyers confirmed the development to NAN.

The case, filed by the aggrieved former National Deputy Chairman of ADC, was earlier before Justice Emeka Nwite of a sister court.

The matter was, however, reassigned to Justice Lifu, following Justice Nwite's recent elevation to the Court of Appeal.

The National Judicial Council (NJC) at its 111th meeting on May 13, had recommended the appointment of 12 new justices of the Court of Appeal, including

Justice Nwite, to President Bola Tinubu for approval.

Gombe, in the suit, is seeking an order restraining Sen. Mark, the embattled National Chairman of ADC; Ogbeni Rauf Aregbesola, the National Secretary, and members of their interim National Working

REJOINDER: FACTS OVER NOISE — ZARIA IS TRANSFORMING UNDER UBA SANI

Every son and daughter of Zaria, Kaduna state deserves more than promises etched on paper — they deserve progress they can see, touch, and live. For three remarkable years, that vision has walked the streets of Zaria under the steady, people-first leadership of Governor Senator Uba Sani. To declare “Zaria is forgotten” is not just inaccurate; it is to willfully close one’s eyes to a city that is being rebuilt, brick by brick, heart by heart.

Within the hallowed walls of Sir Kashim Ibrahim House, Kaduna’s seat of governance, the last three years have been defined by a relentless drive for renewal. Governor Uba Sani’s Rural and Urban Transformation Agenda has been more than a slogan. It is a covenant. It earned him the revered title “Apostle of Rural and Urban Transformation” — Limanin Karkara da Birane — and Zaria, the crown jewel of Northern heritage, stands as one of its grandest beneficiaries. This is governance that does not seek applause in headlines, but reverence in results.

For too long, Unguwar Magajiya bore the scars of neglect — roads that turned to rivers with every rainfall, paths that tested patience more than tires. Today, those stories belong to the past.

The entire Unguwar Magajiya township road network has been reconstructed from foundation to asphalt, crowned with functional drainage that now channels floodwaters away from homes and businesses.

But it did not stop there. Link roads radiating from Unguwar Magajiya through the historic corridors of Zaria City — Limanci down to Kasuwar Amarilu, stretching through Unfuwar Liman to Albatkawa — were graded, stabilised, and asphalted under the bold “Legacy Cities” programme. Zaria was not pushed to the margins. Zaria was placed at the center of the map, where it belongs. This is not continuity abandoned. This is continuity redefined.

A hospital is not just mortar and paint; it is hope made visible. At General Hospital Zaria, also known as Gambo Sawaba General

Hospital, wards once worn by time have been rehabilitated, equipped with modern medical tools, and staffed with more doctors, nurses, and technicians to meet the needs of a growing population.

Across Zaria local government area, primary health centres, the first line of defense for every mother and child, were transformed. Solar power now keeps vaccines cold through the night. Boreholes now bring clean water to waiting patients. Drug revolving funds now ensure shelves are stocked when emergencies strike. This is access. This is dignity. This is government that meets people where they are.

Zaria has always been a city of scholars, and the last three years have honoured that legacy. Public primary and secondary schools across the metropolis were renovated with new classrooms, modern furniture, and water + sanitation facilities under the World Bank-backed AGILE and IDEAS programmes. Children now learn in spaces that inspire, not depress.

At KASU Zaria Campus, the state government reinforced infrastructure and students’ welfare, ensuring our tertiary institutions remain engines of innovation. Beyond classrooms, National Assembly members complemented these efforts with constituency scholarships and ICT training hubs — planting seeds of knowledge that will outlive us all.

Zaria’s transformation extends beyond the obvious. Solar streetlights now glow along suburban roads, making nights safer. Rural electrification projects have brought power to communities long in darkness. Through KADSAP and IFAD, Zaria farmers received inputs, training, and market linkages — because an empowered farmer is a stronger economy.

Water supply interventions are steadily easing the burden on households across the city. These are the quiet revolutions that change lives without making noise.

Let it be said plainly: those peddling the “Zaria Left Behind” narrative are economical with the truth. Their urgency appears driven more by data bundles and the mechanics of social media engagement than by facts on the ground. Meanwhile, Governor Uba Sani has administered with fairness, balance, and an inclusive spirit that reminds every community: your vote matters beyond election day. “Consolidation and Continuity” was never abandoned. It was sharpened — refocused on the basics that matter most: roads our people ply, clinics that save lives, and schools that shape futures.

Is Zaria where it should be? Not yet — and honesty demands we say so. The ancient city still yearns for the revival of its industrial giants: Zarinject, the Ginnery, and other factories that once gave it economic muscle. The much-touted “Zaria Water Project” under the previous El-Rufa’i administration remains, in the words of many citizens, “a sham rainbow rhetoric” — beautiful in promise, absent in delivery. Those are fights for tomorrow.

But to pretend that “nothing has been done” today is to insult the intelligence of every Zaria resident who now drives on smoother roads, whose children learn in better classrooms, and whose sick find care in revamped clinics. Exclusion? No. Zaria is not excluded. Zaria is moving. Zaria is rising.

Let the conversation evolve. Let us retire the tired lament of “we’ve been left behind” and embrace the urgent, optimistic call of “let’s do more, faster.” Zaria’s history is too grand for victimhood. Its future is too bright for cynicism.

Under Uba Sani, a new vision at Sir Kashim Ibrahim Imam House continues to evolve, Zaria is not forgotten. It is being remembered, rebuilt, and repositioned for greatness. Shikenan!

■ The Borno state government has raised the alarm over an outbreak of cholera infecting more than 3,000 people. So far, the outbreak has claimed 37 lives across seven local government areas of the state in May 2026. The executive secretary of the Borno State Contributory Healthcare Management Agency, Saleh Abba-Kaza, stated this in a public health alarm Saturday in Maiduguri. **11**

■ The Minister of Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy, Taiwo Oyedele, has said the economic volatility that followed the removal of petrol subsidy and reforms in the foreign exchange market was unavoidable. Oyedele stated this in an interview with The African Report weekend. He said the reforms were necessary to address distortions created by years of fuel and foreign exchange subsidies. **20**

Business News

■ The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited recorded a remarkable surge in revenue and profitability in April 2026, reflecting improved crude oil production, stronger operational performance, and growing contributions to government finances. According to the company's April 2026 operational and financial report released on Saturday, revenue climbed sharply to N4.97 trillion in April from N2.77 trillion in March, representing a month-on-month increase of approximately 79 percent. **22**

■ Nigeria's official foreign reserves recorded another week of growth, reinforcing confidence in the country's external position amid improving foreign exchange market stability. According to data released by the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), the nation's forex reserves increased by approximately \$359.84 million week-on-week to close at \$49.34 billion as of May 26, 2026, compared with \$48.98 billion recorded at the end of the previous week. **22**

■ Transactions on the floor of Nigerian Exchange (NGX) ended the week on a positive note, gaining N431 billion, supported by selective gains recorded across key major stocks. The benchmark NGX All-Share Index (ASI) advanced by 673.10 basis points week-on-week to close at 250,385.47 points against 249712.37 points recorded in the preceding week, while market capitalisation increased by approximately 0.27 per cent to N160.508 trillion from N160.077 trillion reported a week ago as the year-to-date return strengthened further to 60.90 per cent reflecting sustained, cautious, investor confidence in the domestic equities space. **23**

■ First three years of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu witnessed mixed performance, with economic indicators buoyed by reforms. But some key social indicators appear slow in responding to the reform introduced by the president. For instance, Nigeria's Nominal GDP grew from approximately \$363.85 billion in 2023 to about \$377.36 billion by May 2026, while the Nigeria Exchange (NGX) surged from about N30 trillion in 2023 to N160 trillion by May 2026, an increase of over 633 per cent during the period. **23**

EDITORIAL**ECONOMIC RECOVERY: TINUBU'S CHEST-BEATING STANCE**

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu made a chest-beating remark during the third anniversary of his presidency on May 29, 2026.

The president noted that petrol subsidy withdrawal and foreign exchange reforms have saved Nigeria from economic collapse. He was right.

He made the assertive remark when 16 governors visited him to celebrate Sallah and the third anniversary of his presidency.

Tinubu unilaterally withdrew petrol subsidy through a spontaneous statement that was not in the script of his inaugural speech on May 29, 2023. The president impetuously declared: "Fuel subsidy is gone".

That statement, which unceremoniously ended the treasury looting through dubious petrol subsidy claims, inadvertently triggered a calamitous spike in the pump price of petrol.

The president also ordered the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) to unify the exchange rate of the naira. The CBN had repeatedly ignored the advice of the World Bank to unify the exchange rate to curb forex round-tripping by banks.

The spike in the pump price of petrol triggered by the spontaneous removal of subsidy torched off spiraling inflation which depleted the purchasing power of the naira in consumers' pockets and drastically reduced patronage of goods and services.

The effect of petrol subsidy withdrawal was so severe that it consolidated Nigeria's World Bank infamous toga of "the world headquarters of poverty". About 140 million Nigerians were pushed below poverty line.

The CBN worsened a bad situation by mismanaging the implementation of Tinubu's directive on single exchange rate. The apex bank forced forex end-users to buy forex from banks which were already hoarding the forex allocated to them. The banks sold their allocation to bureau de change (BDC) operators and diverted

forex end-users to them.

The BDC operators who bought forex from banks at high premium hiked their exchange rate because of overwhelming demand. The naira depreciated massively.

The president's chest-thumping remarks on his third anniversary emanated from the fact that the economy is gradually recovering from the plague of subsidy withdrawal and foreign exchange reforms. Subsidy withdrawal, which is being hailed by the World Bank, IMF and even foreign direct and portfolio investors, has blocked the leakages that drained government's revenue.

Before the withdrawal of petrol subsidy, the three tiers of government were sharing a maximum of N700 billion monthly. Now they share well over N2 trillion.

Before the withdrawal of petrol subsidy, state governments were borrowing from the federal government to pay salaries. Now they pay salaries regularly without raising loans. Additionally, state governments now embark upon ambitious infrastructure rehabilitation that is creating jobs and growing the economy.

The federal government itself is probably the greatest beneficiary of the gains from the withdrawal of petrol subsidy and drastic foreign exchange reforms that hitherto inflicted painful consequences on Nigerians.

The huge funds tumbling into the federation account has empowered the federal government to embark upon massive infrastructure rehabilitation that is attracting foreign direct and portfolio investors. The massive road construction embarked upon by the federal government, as a result of the increase in revenue generated by the withdrawal of petrol subsidy, has created thousands of jobs and is growing the economy tremendously. The radical foreign exchange reforms are equally yielding commendable returns.

It has drastically reduced demand pressure on foreign reserves as

fraudulent round-tripping of foreign exchange tumbles. That has resulted in remarkable improvement in the nation's foreign reserves. For more than a decade, Nigeria's foreign reserve had hovered around the jinxed figure of \$33 billion. The reforms in foreign exchange management have raised it to \$50 billion.

That precisely is why foreign direct and portfolio investors are scrambling back to Nigeria. With foreign reserve at a paltry \$33 billion, CBN could not allocate forex to foreign investors and foreign airlines operators to repatriate their ticket sales and proceeds of investment.

Billions of dollars in foreign investors' proceeds of investment were tied down in Nigeria for years. The foreign investors responded to the trapping of their investment proceeds by fleeing the country in droves.

Now they are returning because CBN has cleared the backlog of their investment proceeds with the boom in reserves.

The boom in the Nigerian Stock Exchange (NGX) is attributed to the development in the foreign reserves which now enables the CBN to empower foreign investors to promptly repatriate the proceeds of their investment.

Foreign portfolio investors sunk about \$20 billion into the NGX in 2025. Consequently, NGX is one of the most profitable stock markets globally.

On one frenzied day in May, 2026, market capitalisation of NGX rose by N5 trillion. It gained N60 trillion in the first five months of 2026.

Nigeria's economy is growing impressively. Standards and Poor (S&P), a leading global rating firm, has raised Nigeria's rating from B- to B.

Blueprint commends the president and his team for the bold steps taken to reform the economy.

"This initiative prioritizes reliable, alternative power to cut the high costs of diesel and ease pressure on the national grid, leading to institutional solarization driven by the ECN with its Renewed Hope Solarisation Project which has accelerated the deployment of hybrid systems across tertiary institutions and hospitals in Nigeria.

"The Federal Government's vision is that no federal institution

of higher learning in this country should remain energy-insecure. And that's why we are on that path to delivering over a 100MW of alternative energy sources across 72 Primary Health Care Centers and Tertiary Institutions.

"This has also given rise to Partnerships facilitated by the ECN, securing a landmark agreement with China's LONGi, the world's largest solar panel manufacturer to build a solar panel production facility in Nigeria for all its benefits in terms of manufacturing locally and export while creating jobs for the Nigerian citizens.

"This drive to energize the institutions will continue, state by state, institution by institution, until that vision is realised. The Renewed Hope Solarisation Initiative is not a project, it is a programme, and

the groundbreaking are milestones among many others.

"The Phase 1 of the program will deliver a complete system, intelligent energy infrastructure. The solar photovoltaic array will be paired with a battery energy storage system for power continuity beyond daylight hours. It will be installed in decentralised clusters and not a single large installation to improve resilience and ease management."

Ebola: FAAN, Lagos step up Ebola surveillance at airport

The Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FAAN), Lagos state government health officials, and Port Health Services have reinforced measures to prevent the importation and spread of Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) through the Murtala Muhammed Airport (MMA), Lagos, following a joint inspection of the airport's preparedness facilities.

The inspection was conducted to assess the airport's readiness to detect, monitor and respond to any potential Ebola threat, particularly in light of recent developments surrounding the outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).

The exercise brought together key stakeholders from the health and aviation sectors, including the Lagos state Commissioner for Health, Akinola Abayomi; MMIA Airport Manager, Olatokunbo Arewa; General Manager, Aviation Medical, FAAN, Ibrahim Bilikisu; the permanent secretary, Lagos state Ministry of Health, Dayo Lajide; the special adviser to the governor on Health, Kemi Ogunyemi; and the State Epidemiologist, Ismail Abdus-Salam, among others.

Speaking during the inspection, Mr Abayomi commended FAAN and other stakeholders for their swift response to developments relating to the Ebola outbreak in the DRC and the proactive preventive measures already in place at the airport.

He stated the need for heightened vigilance and stricter surveillance, particularly in monitoring passengers arriving from high-risk countries.

In his remarks, the Airport Manager, Mr Arewa, assured the visiting delegation of FAAN's commitment to sustaining all necessary preventive measures and adhering to established health regulations. (Premium Times)

Lassa fever often mistaken for malaria, medical expert warns

A medical expert, Dr Nosa Ehigie, Sunday warned that Lassa fever is frequently mistaken for malaria in its early stages, often leading to delayed diagnosis, treatment and increased health risks for patients.

Ehigie, the Medical Director of Owen Hospital, Benin, said this in an interview, Sunday.

He said the disease often begins with symptoms similar to malaria, including fever, weakness and general body discomfort.

He advised that any patient being treated for malaria or typhoid fever who fails to respond to medication should immediately be evaluated for possible Lassa fever.

He added that suspicion becomes stronger when persistent fever is accompanied by bleeding symptoms, underscoring the need for prompt medical evaluation, laboratory testing and timely intervention to reduce complications significantly.

"Lassa fever is a type of viral

haemorrhagic disease.

"It is classified as an acute viral haemorrhagic fever, which means that while many cases are mild or completely asymptomatic, severe cases can damage blood vessels, cause organ failure and uncontrolled bleeding.

"The disease may progress to vomiting blood, coughing up blood or other forms of bleeding.

"Once such symptoms appear, there should be a high index of suspicion and the case should be reported

immediately," he said.

The medical director added that Lassa fever could be transmitted through contact with infected body fluids and secretions, adding that people who handle rodents with bare hands face a higher risk of exposure.

He identified the Irrua Specialist Teaching Hospital in Edo as a major centre for the diagnosis and treatment of the disease, adding that private hospitals should refer confirmed cases to designated facilities. (NAN)

Oyo state government to ensure the safe release of the victims.

The bandits invaded the school May 15, during which they kidnapped the principal, several teachers and some students.

Days after, one of the victims, a teacher, identified as Michael Oyedokun, was seen killed in a disturbing viral video released by the kidnappers.

...FG assures

Leading a delegation of the federal government to the affected communities,

Gbajabiamila stressed that President Tinubu remained deeply concerned about the abduction and had approved the recruitment of 1,000 forest guards in Oyo state and ordered the deployment of a specialised security team to intensify efforts to rescue the abducted pupils and teachers.

Addressing residents in both English and Yoruba, Gbajabiamila said the president's decision to dispatch the nation's top security leadership to the affected communities reflected his determination to deploy every available resource towards securing the victims' release.

"Mr. President is deeply troubled by this incident. Whatever it takes, our children and teachers will be brought back home safely. He has issued all necessary directives and is providing every support required by our security agencies to achieve that objective.

"Your pain and anxiety are understood. By the grace of God,

your children will return safely to your arms.

"Mr. President also saw the appeals from some parents and community members urging caution in the rescue efforts. Let me assure you that the operation will be intelligence-led and carefully coordinated, deploying both kinetic and non-kinetic measures to secure the safe return of the victims," Gbajabiamila was quoted as saying in a statement by the Special Adviser to the President on Information and Strategy, Bayo Onanuga.

The delegation was also at the palace of the Soun of Ogbomoso land, HRM Kabiyesi Ghandi Afolabi Olaye to commiserate with him and his people.

The delegation also met with the wife of the deceased school teacher, Mrs. Mary Oyedokun and her two children.

Gbajabiamila, delivered President Tinubu's condolences with a promise that the family will not suffer.

"The President is disturbed by what has happened and is committed to bringing the children and their teachers back safely. Every necessary support has been provided to the security agencies to achieve this objective," he said.

Assuring community leaders, parents and residents that the federal government would not relent until the victims were reunited with their families, Gbajabiamila said the rescue operation would be guided by intelligence and executed with utmost caution to safeguard the lives of those in captivity.

On the appeals from community

members in the area that security agencies should avoid actions that could endanger the hostages, the Chief of Staff assured that both military and non-military strategies were being carefully coordinated to ensure a successful outcome.

In the team were the National Security Adviser Nuhu Ribadu, Minister of Defence Christopher Musa, Inspector-General of Police Tunji Disu, Minister of Power Joseph Tegbe, and Special Adviser to the President on Media and Public Communications, Sunday Dare.

...Enough of blame game - Makinde

Meanwhile, Oyo state Governor Seyi Makinde has cautioned against blame game over the abducted teachers and students.

Speaking weekend during his visit to families of the abducted principal, teachers and students of 3 schools in Ahoro Esiele, Governor Makinde said there was no basis for trading blame between the state government, the federal government, local governments or any other institution.

The governor pointed out that what should be the concern of all now is how to rescue the abducted people and to reunite them back to their families.

He stated that his administration would deploy every lawful means to secure their safe release and noted that the abductors are dangerous and unpredictable, hence making it impossible to disclose certain operational details to the public on the incident.

"This is not the time to trade

blame between the state government, the federal government, local governments or any other institution. This is a time for unity. Let us come together with one purpose: to rescue our children and their teachers safely," he said.

The governor added: "The people we are dealing with are dangerous and unpredictable. Because this is an ongoing security operation, there are certain details I cannot disclose. However, I want to assure you that every available resource is being deployed to secure the release of the victims.

"Please believe in me. I have not been sleeping well myself. Together with the service commanders, we meet twice every day, in the morning and at night, sometimes until 10 or 11 p.m."

...APC knocks Makinde

But the state chapter of the All Progressives Congress (APC) has condemned Governor Seyi Makinde's comments on the security situation in the state.

The party was reacting to Makinde's comment made Saturday during his acceptance speech as the presidential candidate of the Allied Peoples Movement (APM) in Ibadan Saturday.

The governor, at the event, lamented that there was little he could do to rescue kidnapped schoolchildren and other victims due to limited control over security agencies.

The party's spokesman, Olawale Sadare, in a statement Sunday,

described the governor's remarks as "a height of cluelessness, insincerity and criminal ineptitude," adding that he cannot shirk responsibility for the security challenges facing the state.

It said: "Parochial leaders like Makinde pose a grave danger to the growth and development of the Nigerian society, and it is important for the electorate to avoid them in future elections."

...Ex-defence spokesman, wife abducted

In another security-related development, a former Director of Defence Information, Rabe Abubakar, and his wife, were reportedly abducted by suspected bandits in Katsina state.

The couple were said to be on their way to Katsina Saturday when the hoodlums waylaid their vehicle in Matazu local government area and whisked them off.

Confirming the development, spokesperson of the Katsina State Police Command, Abubakar Aliyu, said the Police had launched a manhunt to rescue the general and his wife.

"The attack occurred at about 11a.m. on Saturday when the assailants, armed with dangerous weapons, intercepted a red Peugeot 406 saloon, carrying the general and his wife and traveling along the route.

"The driver, Abdullahi Sa'id, sustained a gunshot wound to his right arm during the attack, the general and his wife were abducted before security operatives arrived at the scene," said the police image maker in the state.

According to him, the Commissioner of Police had visited the scene for an on-the-spot assessment and deployed additional tactical units and resources to support rescue efforts.

"Upon receiving the report, the Divisional Police Officer in Matazu, accompanied by operatives of the Village Community Response Unit (VCRU), swiftly mobilised to the scene.

"The team secured the area and evacuated the injured driver to a medical facility for treatment," he added.

Aliyu said: "Efforts to rescue the General and his wife, and apprehend the perpetrators are ongoing, and further developments will be communicated as investigations progress."

ADC crisis: Court to hear Bala-Gombe's suit against Mark, Aregbesola Wednesday

Committee (NWC) from parading themselves as the party's leaders.

He had argued that the emergence of Mark, Aregbesola and other NWC members as party's leaders breached the provisions of the party's constitution and the Electoral Act.

Gombe had sued ADC, Mark, Aregbesola, Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) and Ralph Nwosu as 1st to 5th defendants respectively in the suit marked: FHC/ABJ/CS/1819/2025.

Nwosu was the former ADC National Chairman who stepped down for David Mark leadership of the party.

Justice Nwite had, on April 14, adjourned the case sine die (indefinitely) following Gombe's request to await the Supreme Court's judgment in the appeal filed by Mark.

However, the Supreme Court, on April 30, set aside the order made by the Court of Appeal in Abuja ordering the maintenance of status quo ante bellum in the leadership dispute in ADC, on which INEC acted in derecognising the Mark-led leadership of the party.

The apex court ordered the parties to return to the FHC for expeditious hearing of the case filed by Gombe, an aggrieved chieftain of the party.

NAN observes that INEC had, since, complied with the Supreme Court judgment by reversing the removal of Mark-led leadership from the commission's official

portal.

When the case came up on May 8 before Justice Nwite following the Supreme Court order, Luka Haruna, SAN, who appeared for Gombe, sought the transfer of the case from Nwite to another judge.

Although no reason was given, Haruna said a letter had been written to the CJ to the effect.

But lawyers to the ADC, Mark, Aregbesola and Nwosu, disagreed with the application.

ADC's counsel, Rilwan Okpanachi; Suleiman Usman, SAN, who appeared for Mark; Mohammed Sheriff, who represented Aregbesola; P. I. Oyewole, counsel for Chief Ralph Nwosu, and other lawyers in the case vehemently opposed Gombe's request for the case transfer.

The lawyers, who said that Gombe's letter had not been served on them, described Haruna's application as "an ambush."

They also considered the request as an attempt to frustrate the order of Appeal Court for accelerated hearing which was sustained by the Supreme Court.

The defence lawyers, who described Gombe's application as 'forum shopping,' said the only good thing the application for the transfer of the matter had achieved was that the integrity of the court had been confirmed.

They said this was so because nothing tangible had happened since the last adjournment.

The lawyers said they maintained absolute confidence in the integrity, impartiality and sound judicial

discretion of Justice Nwite's court.

"The so-called letter in a normal view, is a fundamental breach of procedure, amounting in law to an illegality and not a mere irregularity," they argued.

They said they would have insisted that the court should go on with the hearing but for a certified true copy (CTC) of the Supreme Court judgment which was yet to be obtained, in order for the trial court to be properly guided by it.

They, therefore, sought an indefinite adjournment to enable them furnish the judge with the CTC of the judgment and Justice Nwite adjourned the case sine die (indefinitely), pending when its

CTC is obtained.

NAN reports that former Vice President Atiku Abubakar emerged as ADC presidential candidate on May 27 after defeating two other aspirants, including Rotimi Amaechi, former Minister of Transportation, at the party's national convention.

Also, Dumebi Kachikwu, in a national convention conducted by another faction of ADC, emerged the presidential candidate of the party for the 2027 general election.

The 2023 presidential candidate of the party was adopted by factional members of the party as sole presidential candidate on May 24. (NAN)

Maintenance bills straining Ilorin Central Mosque, BoT cries out

Trustees, Management Committee, Central Working Committee, and stakeholders, held in Ilorin over the weekend.

He however commended the support of the Emir of Ilorin, Alhaji (Dr.) Ibrahim Sulu-Gambari and other prominent individuals, while noting that the mosque remains one of the most iconic religious structures in Nigeria.

He said among the major works completed during the year under review were the installation of 20 solar-powered security lights, repainting of the mosque's domes with golden finish, repair of solar panels, installation of a solar-powered pumping machine, and completion of utility works at the Idi-Ape Old Mosque.

The ongoing projects include the

renovation of fountains, restoration of internet facilities, and replacement of damaged internal speaker systems.

On the long-standing plan to replace the mosque's main hall rug, the secretary disclosed that although N40 million had been donated and preserved since 2021, the current cost now exceeds N100 million, leaving the project stalled due to insufficient funding.

He further revealed that the Mosque has no steady source of income or investment, making it heavily dependent on donations and periodic interventions.

"To address this, delegations were sent to Abuja and Lagos to seek support from prominent indigenes, yielding encouraging responses.

"Among proposed future projects is the development of a 250-bed student hostel at the University of Ilorin, for which a letter of intent has already been

submitted.

"Despite these efforts, challenges such as epileptic power supply, electricity bills exceeding N1 million monthly, and diesel costs nearing N700,000 continue to strain the Mosque's finances".

Alhaji AbdulGafar, who acknowledged the monthly N5 million support to the mosque from Alhaji Aliko Dangote, urged collective responsibility in preserving the mosque, warning that neglect could lead to deterioration.

"Ilorin Central Jum'at Mosque belongs to all of us. We must maintain it for ourselves and for generations yet unborn," he said.

The meeting ended with prayers and a renewed call for unity, sacrifice, and sustained contributions towards the preservation of one of Ilorin's most cherished religious landmarks.

Cleric cautions against politics of bitterness, calls for unity

Rev. Fr. Peter Uzozie, the priest in charge of St Francis Catholic Parish, Enugwu-Ukwu, Anambra, has called on politicians to eschew politics of bitterness ahead of the 2027 general elections.

The priest said politics was meant to build the society for the common good of all citizens irrespective of their social status, religious line and political alignments and not otherwise.

Uzozie made the call Sunday in Enugwu-Ukwu in Njikoka local government area of Anambra, during a church thanksgiving by Mr Emeka Ozumba who lost a ticket for the state House of Assembly under the All Progressives Grand Alliance (APGA).

The priest stated that Ozumba contested the state assembly primary election under APGA and lost to Mr Chidi Ibemeka, the incumbent representing Njikoka 1 state constituency.

He charged the public not to

allow themselves to be negatively used by politicians who still maintain their relationships with their opponents after elections.

He said some politicians created a false impression of enmity between their opponents after elections while their supporters unknowingly fight each other for their sake.

Uzozie commended Ibeamaka for joining Ozumba in his thanksgiving after his loss to him during APGA's state assembly primary even uninvited and described the conduct as worth emulating by other politicians.

"There are no reasons to hold bitterness against each other in anything in life, note that a seat will be taken by one person at a time. "This is political maturity at play and a huge spirit of sportsmanship on display. Politicians across the country should emulate this humility," Uzozie said.

He also warned party faithful

to shun politics of bitterness and sounded stern warning that the church would not be roped into politics of bitterness rather he advised the people to be politically active by participating conscientiously.

Uzozie urged the public to shun the ideology of one party system and warned the politicians to unite the nation rather than being cancerous to the system but act through an open system where inclusiveness worked.

In response, the state lawmaker, Ibeamaka said that he heard of the thanksgiving of Ozumba after losing the primary to him and he was touched to come for solidarity.

Ibeamaka said he held Ozumba in high esteem and respect knowing that he had been in politics before him and prayed for true unity between them to face the main election

Lagos police debunk viral video of armed Fulani men arrested in Ikorodu

The Lagos state police command, weekend, dismissed as misleading a viral video circulating on social media that purportedly shows the recent arrest of Fulani men found with arms and ammunition in Ikorodu, Lagos state.

In a statement issued by the command's spokesperson, SP Adebisi Abimbola, the police clarified that the footage is an old video of an incident

that occurred more than three years ago and does not reflect the current security situation in Ikorodu or any other part of the state.

She said the recirculation of the outdated clip has the potential to create unnecessary panic, fear, and apprehension among residents. Authorities urged members of the public to disregard the video and avoid sharing unverified information capable of disrupting public peace and undermining confidence in security efforts.

The police also cautioned social media users and content creators against the deliberate spread of false, unverified, and alarmist content, warning that individuals found responsible for disseminating misinformation could face investigation and prosecution under existing laws.

Meanwhile, the Commissioner of Police, Tijani Fatai, has directed the sustained deployment of personnel and operational assets to identified black spots, strategic locations, and

entry and exit points across Lagos state.

The command noted that the security measures are being implemented in collaboration with other security and safety agencies to ensure the continued protection of lives and property across the state.

Residents were encouraged to go about their lawful activities without fear and to remain vigilant by providing prompt and credible information on suspicious persons, movements, or activities within their communities.

Obi to Nigerians: Don't borrow to fund weddings, use money for family

The presidential candidate of the Nigeria Democratic Congress (NDC), Peter Obi, has urged Nigerians to shun flamboyant weddings.

The former governor of Anambra state spoke at the David and Goliath Conference, convened by Rev. Fr. John Oluoma.

Held at the Holy Trinity Event Centre, Maitama, Abuja, weekend, Obi advised Nigerians to avoid spending huge sums of money on weddings only to end up falling into debt.

His advice falls within the politician's reputation for frugality and fiscal discipline, a defining

hallmark of his political identity.

In a 2022 interview, Obi was reputed to have said that he is frugal but not stingy.

He also ran his presidential campaign under the Labour Party on the mantra, "we no de give shishi."

Speaking at the conference, the presidential candidate said he has been married for over 30 years, yet no one can claim to have attended his wine-carrying or wedding.

"Because the number was few, in each case, there were no more than a dozen. I do not see how we can carry the money, call people, entertain them, and then go home and start

quarrelling.

"My wife wanted it, but I said, 'No. We need this money at home. That's what happens today. They go and do this wine carrying. Do this white wedding and start quarrelling because they are now owing for drinks,'" he said.

Obi said as a trader, a good number of people owed him for drinks they had used at their weddings.

He also pointed out that spending a lot on weddings causes friction in the home.

"They will quarrel because the man now becomes annoyed over little things. What is annoying him is the money he spent on wine carrying and

the wedding," he said.

The presidential hopeful also had similar advice regarding birthday celebrations, especially for kids.

"You have a child's one-year or two-year celebration. That is not school fees. Use that money to pay their school fees.

"The same thing with birthday parties, celebrate your birthday parties alone. If you can't afford it, don't even bother. Don't call anybody. Go to Mass and go home," he added.

Obi also touched on the nation's power challenges, comparing it to Egypt's.

He said as of 2016, Egypt was generating less than 20,000 megawatts.

By 2021, the country had expanded its power generation capacity to over 45,000 megawatts.

"As we speak, Egypt exports power to Europe because they are now producing more they need. It is an African country. It is not rocket science.

"The contractors that are doing it in Egypt, I sat down with them. I talked with them. And I asked them, you are also working in Nigeria, why is it working in Egypt, it's not working in Nigeria. They told me it is a Nigerian problem," he said.

Milk Day: FG targets 37,000 women, youth in livestock empowerment scheme

The federal government has unveiled plans to create economic opportunities for 37,000 women and young Nigerians through a proposed Women and Youth in Livestock Empowerment Initiative aimed at boosting participation across the livestock value chain, particularly in the dairy sector.

Minister of Livestock Development, Idi Maiha, stated this Saturday in Abuja during activities marking the 2026 World Milk Day celebration.

Represented by his senior special assistant, Prof. Eustace Iyayi, the minister said the initiative forms part of the government's broader strategy to transform Nigeria's livestock industry while promoting inclusive growth and economic empowerment.

He said the programme is designed to support women and youth engaged in dairy production, processing, marketing and agribusiness through targeted interventions that will enhance productivity and income generation.

Maiha added that the initiative, which is currently undergoing stakeholder consultations and programme design, would provide beneficiaries with skills acquisition, enterprise support, access to finance, technology transfer, cooperative strengthening and market integration opportunities.

He said: "As we celebrate women dairy farmers this year, we recognise their critical role in strengthening household nutrition, supporting rural livelihoods and driving agricultural growth. Our goal is to build an inclusive dairy industry that empowers women and youth while contributing to national food security and economic development."

The minister noted that the establishment of the Federal Ministry of Livestock Development by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu under the Renewed Hope Agenda had laid the foundation for coordinated reforms aimed at unlocking the potential of Nigeria's livestock and dairy industries.

He further stated that the ministry had validated the National Dairy Policy Implementation Framework following a stakeholders' engagement held in November 2025, adding that the framework would be officially unveiled on June 1, 2026.

Maiha said the framework provides a roadmap for achieving measurable outcomes in the dairy sector, while efforts under the National Livestock Growth Acceleration Strategy (NL-GAS) are being intensified to increase local milk production and drive dairy industrialisation.

Cholera kills 37 in Borno, endangers 3,000 lives

The Borno state government has raised the alarm over an outbreak of cholera infecting more than 3,000 people.

So far, the outbreak has claimed 37 lives across seven local government areas of the state in May 2026.

The executive secretary of the Borno State Contributory Healthcare Management Agency, Saleh Abba-Kaza, stated this in a public health alarm Saturday in Maiduguri.

He urged residents to take urgent preventive measures to curb the spread of the disease.

He said the outbreak was first reported on 1 May and subsequently confirmed on 4 May, as cases increased across affected communities, adding that more than 100 new cases were recorded within the last 24 hours, while Maiduguri Metropolitan Council (MMC) remained the epicentre of the outbreak with over 2,000 reported cases.

"Jere LGA has recorded over 1,000 cases, while Mafa, Konduga, Monguno, Ngala and Magumeri LGAs have also been affected," he said.

Abba-Kaza noted that the outbreak had spread to 36 wards and more than 138 communities, adding that the state's healthcare system was under significant pressure due to the increasing number of cases.

He attributed the outbreak largely to poor water, sanitation and hygiene conditions, including contamination of pipe-borne water sources and dams, as well as the persistence of open defecation in some communities.

"With the rainy season already underway, waste materials and human excreta may be washed into residential areas, increasing the risk of transmission," he warned.

He urged residents to chlorinate drinking water, maintain proper sanitation practices, dispose of waste appropriately and ensure regular hand-washing with soap, particularly before meals and after using the toilet.

The public health expert also called for early reporting of symptoms such as vomiting and watery diarrhoea

to the nearest healthcare facility, warning against self-medication or treatment by unqualified persons.

"Prompt medical attention can save lives. Suspected cases should be reported immediately, and affected persons evacuated to designated treatment centres," he said.

Mr Abba-Kaza said the state government was making efforts to secure cholera vaccines but emphasised that vaccination alone could not replace adherence to proper water, sanitation and hygiene

practices.

He commended the Borno State Ministry of Health and its partners for their response efforts, including the World Health Organisation (WHO), UNICEF, Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), Save the Children, RUWASSA and others.

He called on community leaders, development partners and residents to intensify awareness campaigns and support ongoing interventions to contain the outbreak.

Tinubu launches 145 tricycle ambulances to enhance emergency medical response

President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, weekend, launched 145 tricycle ambulances aimed at improving emergency healthcare services across the country.

have successfully thwarted a planned kidnap operation and neutralised a suspected terrorist during a well-coordinated ambush in Lokoja local government area of Kogi state.

This was contained in a statement issued Sunday by the acting assistant director, Army Public Relations, 12 Brigade, Nigerian Army, Lt Hassan Abdullahi.

The statement said the operation was carried out on May 30, 2026,

sequel to a credible intelligence report indicating that a group of terrorists was planning to launch kidnapping attacks within the Jakura II community.

"Acting swiftly on the intelligence, the troops deployed to a suspected crossing point along the old Obajana-Tajimi road, where they strategically laid an ambush to deny the criminal elements freedom of movement.

"Upon making contact, the troops engaged the terrorists in a gun duel. At the end of the encounter, one of the

suspects was neutralised, while others fled the scene with suspected gunshot wounds.

"Subsequent exploitation of the area led to the recovery of one AK-47 rifle, five magazines, 70 rounds of 7.62mm special ammunition, a bandolier, and mobile phones" the statement said.

The military authorities noted that the recovered items further confirmed the group's involvement in kidnapping activities in the area, adding that successful operation underscores the

determination of troops of the 12 Brigade to sustain offensive actions against terrorists and other criminal elements threatening the security of law-abiding citizens.

The statement added that efforts are ongoing to track down and apprehend the fleeing suspects.

"Commander of the 12 Brigade, Brigadier General Kasim Umar Sidi, commended the troops for their vigilance, combat efficiency and dedication to duty," he stated.

Ondo: Police crack interstate vehicle syndicate, arrest 6 over N71m fraud

The Ondo state police command has uncovered an alleged interstate vehicle fraud syndicate and arrested six suspects in connection with the illegal sale of three heavy-duty vehicles, valued at more than ₦71 million.

The suspects are: Adeola Kolawole, 56, Alhaji Gani Bello, 73, Oladoja Akeem, 56, Wasiu Adigun, 55, Azeez Yusuf, 49 and Ojo Mudasiru, 40,

They were all apprehended in Ibadan, Oyo state, following a police investigation that stretched across state boundaries.

Police sources stated that the case originated from a complaint by a businessman, Mr. Paul Aderemi of Ondo town, who alleged that three trucks he had purchased in 2025 had mysteriously disappeared from their storage location.

The vehicles, comprising a low-loader truck, a tipper truck, and a small truck, were reportedly worth about ₦71 million.

Investigators said the complainant had entrusted the vehicles to one of the suspects, Adeola Kolawole, under an agreed arrangement. Trouble, however, started when the owner allegedly discovered that the trucks had been sold without his knowledge or approval.

Acting on the report, detectives attached to the Fagun Division launched an intelligence-led investigation that led to the arrest of the principal suspect.

Police said Kolawole allegedly confessed during interrogation

that he sold the vehicles to another suspect, Alhaji Gani Bello, in Ibadan.

The revelation reportedly opened a trail that enabled detectives to track down and arrest five other suspects believed to have participated in the transaction.

Sources within the command stated that the suspects allegedly made statements detailing their respective roles in the deal, while investigators intensified efforts to recover the missing trucks and determine whether other members of the syndicate were still at large.

Nigerian creators must compete globally - Filmmaker

Documentary filmmaker and media entrepreneur, Samuel Ojo, has challenged Nigerian content creators and filmmakers to abandon what he described as a 'local mindset' and begin measuring their work against global standards if the country's creative industry is to achieve meaningful international relevance.

Ojo, who spoke during a one-day filmmaking and content creation workshop organised by Creativeverse Limited in partnership with Holland Academy and Aputure in Abuja,

said Nigerian creatives must move beyond celebrating incremental local improvements and focus on producing content capable of competing with the best productions from around the world.

He said the Nigerian creative industry has made significant progress over the years, but the next phase of growth requires creators to benchmark themselves against leading global industries such as those in the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom.

"I think Nigerian creators need to start judging with world standards and not local standards. We need to start competing internationally. Can our movies compete internationally?"

Can the level of our production compete internationally?" he asked.

"Of course, people will argue that we are better than we used to be. Fine, we are better than we used to be when we compare ourselves to some neighbouring countries. But what happens when we compare ourselves to the UK, Canada or the American film industry? We need to start thinking globally."

The founder of Sam Friend Ojo Media noted that one of the major challenges slowing the growth of the industry is a culture of mediocrity, where creators are often satisfied with being slightly above average rather than striving for excellence.

"There is a thing around

mediocrity in Nigeria. As long as you are just better than average, people think you are good enough. We need to see beyond that," he said.

Ojo further urged Nigerian creatives who have acquired international exposure and training to contribute towards raising industry standards at home rather than settling into existing practices.

"Creators who have gone abroad and returned need to do better. They need to set standards. When we watch Hollywood productions, they should not look impossible to achieve. Our productions should be able to compete with them," he added.

Wike declares amnesty for political adversaries in Rivers

The Minister of the Federal Capital Territory (FCT), Nyesom Wike, has extended an unexpected olive branch to his political opponents in Rivers state, declaring a total amnesty and proclaiming, "I have forgiven everybody."

Speaking at the Rainbow Coalition luncheon for candidates in the 2027 general elections held Saturday in Port Harcourt, the former Rivers state governor balanced this major

political reconciliation move with a showcase of administrative triumph, announcing an unprecedented 31-day project commissioning across the nation's capital.

Wike stated that the rapid infrastructural development unfolding under his watch is a direct testament to purposeful leadership, throwing down a challenge to critics to match the scale of the ongoing works.

Pivoting to a surprisingly

reconciliatory tone regarding the intense political friction in his home state, the minister offered a blanket pardon to all political opponents. He urged estranged allies and adversaries alike to abandon divisive tactics and return to a unified fold.

"I use this opportunity today, the platform... I have forgiven everybody," Wike stated, adding that prolonged political warfare serves no constructive purpose.

"I want you to come back home.

We have played politics, we have abused ourselves, this is the right time for you to come back," he stated.

The minister urged opposition figures to swallow their pride and reintegrate into the dominant political fabric of the state, advising them to reach out to other stakeholders to rebuild broken bridges.

Highlighting his milestones in the FCT, Wike revealed that the scale of infrastructure slated for showcase goes far beyond minor community interventions, attributing the achievements to the strategic backing and vision of the president.

He said the month-long commissioning circuit is expected to feature major road networks, public utilities, and massive urban renewal projects designed to reshape the capital territory. Brushing aside critics, Wike issued a direct challenge regarding the quality of his administration's output.

"This third year of Mr. President alone, we are taking 31 days for commissioning of projects in Abuja. I'm not talking about boreholes. I challenge anybody," he said.

Despite the sweeping offer of peace, the minister did not mince words regarding the resilience of his political structure back home, which he described as an invincible "rainbow coalition."

He explicitly warned external actors against attempting to destabilise Rivers state under the guise of exploiting federal allocations distributed to sub-national governments.

Wike reiterated that anyone attempting to trigger a crisis in Rivers state would face severe backlash.

"Anybody from another state who is trying to destroy Rivers state, the person will have problems. You put your hand, you get fire," he stated.

NDLEA uncovers illicit drugs hidden in water purifiers from Europe

Operatives of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) have uncovered consignments of hard drugs concealed in water purifier machines imported from the Netherlands, while also intercepting a cache of military-grade ammunition in Kaduna state as part of ongoing nationwide anti-narcotics operations.

The agency said through the director of Media and Advocacy, Femi Babafemi, that the illicit consignments comprising three kilograms of ketamine and 199 grams of MDMA, popularly known as Ecstasy, were carefully hidden inside water purifier machines shipped from Europe. The drugs were discovered and seized at a courier company in

Lagos on May 26.

In a separate operation in Kaduna state, NDLEA operatives arrested a couple, Musa Sunday and Mercy Sunday, alongside another suspect, Salomi Ezekiel, 38, following the recovery of 100 jumbo bags of skunk weighing 1,246 kilograms from their residence in the Goni Gora area on May 24.

The agency also recorded another major breakthrough in the state when officers on patrol along the Abuja-Kaduna Highway at Jere intercepted a 30-year-old suspect, Sunusi Musa, who was allegedly transporting 380 rounds of military-grade 7.62mm ammunition to Katsina state.

NDLEA said the suspect and the ammunition had been handed over to the appropriate security agency for further investigation and prosecution.

In Niger state, operatives acting on intelligence raided a warehouse in Gidan Kukah, Bosso local government area, where 457 kilograms of skunk were recovered on May 27. A suspect, Godwin Zakka, 46, was subsequently arrested at his residence in the Gbeganu area of Minna in connection with the seizure.

The Islamic cleric warned the pilgrims to desist from sinful acts, saying that the mere contemplation of such acts are recorded as if the sins have been committed.

UNICEF, Enugu train health workers on how to administer nutrient supplement

Enugu State Primary Healthcare Development Agency (PHDA) and the Ministry of Health, in collaboration with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), have conducted a three-day intensive training for frontline health workers on the use of Small Quantity LIPID-BASED Nutrient Supplement (SQ-LNS), MMS and MUAC screening.

The three day intensive training was attended by health workers

from the 17 local government areas of the primary health centres in Enugu state.

The micro nutrient supplement is to be given to children between the ages of 6 months to 23 months to enable them feed well and not suffer malnutrition or stunted growth.

Speaking at the end of the training, the Chief of UNICEF Field Office, Enugu, Juliet Chiluwe, thanked the Enugu state government for making available the counterpart fund for the procurement of the enhanced SQ-

LNS micro nutrient supplement.

Chiluwe said part of their mandates is to partner with states to ensure that the right of children is attained; pointing out that the training would enable the participating health workers to scale the training down to other health workers and ensure the even distribution of the commodities to end users.

"The mandate of UNICEF is to partner with states to ensure that the rights of children are attained. By attaining the right of children, it implies that the state is benefiting

from having a high human capital index.

"So the government of Enugu State under the leadership of Gov. Peter Mbah partnered with UNICEF to the Child Nutrition Fund and also support from US. We are finalizing the training for frontline health workers who will administer the nutrients to children at the health centres."

She urged caregivers and mothers to afford themselves the opportunity of accessing the commodities for the welfare of their children.

Opposition building castles in the air – Nataro

Kebbi state ex-governorship candidate and popular agitator for public sector reform, Mallam Salihu Isa Nataro, has accused the opposition political parties in Nigeria of lacking the capacity to proffer solution to the nation's challenges and therefore unable to convince the masses of their ability to do better if elected.

The public finance expert stressed that "Nigeria is united and among the richest countries on earth and we Nigerians are proud to have millions of Yorubas in the North and South East, millions of Hausas in the West and South East and millions of Igbo in the West and North."

He continued, "I will advise anybody locally and internationally, thinking of breaking Nigeria, to have rethink," he said.

Nataro also advocated for good relationship with other West African countries to enable the introduction of a common currency that would engender more unity among the nations and ensure peaceful coexistence in the subregion.

The staunch supporter of President Bola Tinubu, however, said he was opposed to foreign loans, saying

the country could obtain loans for massive industrialisation from billionaires within the country instead of depending on the World Bank, IMF and the Paris Club.

The public sector finance expert also said he was totally opposed to federal government's plans for salary increase in the public service without looking at duplication of functions in

the respective ministries, agencies and departments.

He commended the Ministry of Defence for adopting local production of armament to reduce cost, however, adding that the country still needed Republic of Iran and Russia to train Nigeria's personnel in drone tech, cyber capability and robot tech for modern warfare.

Reps aspirant Benjamin alleges manipulation of primaries in ADC

House of Representatives aspirant, Edeh Benjamin, has strongly rejected the outcome of the African Democratic Congress (ADC) primary elections, alleging manipulation of the exercise.

He said the exercise as a direct assault on internal democracy, transparency, and the collective aspirations of party members across the constituency.

Benjamin who contested the just concluded primaries in Obudu/Bekwarra/Obanliku federal constituency of Cross River state, in a statement on Saturday disclosed that a petition had already been submitted to the national leadership of the party.

The aspirant further alleged that the primary process was compromised by powerful interests determined to impose

outcomes that did not reflect the genuine will of party delegates and grassroots supporters.

According to him, the controversy surrounding the primary was not merely a personal political dispute but a reflection of deeper structural challenges threatening the credibility and future of the ADC, particularly within the South-South region.

He specifically accused former Minister of Niger Delta Affairs, Usani Usani, of playing a significant role in what he described as the weakening of the ADC's political structures across Cross River state and parts of the South-South.

Benjamin alleged that the actions and influence of certain political actors had contributed to internal divisions, weakened grassroots mobilisation, and reduced the party's competitiveness in

key electoral battlegrounds.

"The issue before us is bigger than one individual or one constituency. It concerns the survival of democratic values within our party. When legitimate victories are overturned through manipulation and political interference, the confidence of members and supporters is severely damaged," Benjamin stated.

He also alleged that despite emerging as the rightful winner, efforts were made to substitute his mandate with what he described as a politically weak and unpopular candidate lacking the electoral strength to secure victory at even the ward level.

Benjamin therefore called on the ADC National Working Committee (NWC), party elders, and democratic stakeholders to conduct a thorough review of the primary process and ensure that justice prevailed.

Gov Okpebholo's ally Okungbowa arrested for allegedly assaulting police officer

The Edo state police command Sunday said it plans to arraign Mr. Kelly Okungbowa, popularly known as 'Ebo Stone' and an ally of Edo state governor, Monday Okpebholo, over alleged assault of a police officer on duty.

Okungbowa was arrested by operatives of the command following an incident said to have occurred Saturday evening around the Upper Sakponba axis in Ikpoba-Okha local government area of the state.

Blueprint gathered that the suspect allegedly assaulted a police officer who was carrying out lawful duties on the road.

Confirming the arrest, Sunday, the Police Public Relations

Officer of the command, ASP Eno Ikoedem, said the suspect is currently in custody and would be charged to court soon.

She added that no individual is above the law and urged members of the public to accord due respect to police officers while carrying out their lawful responsibilities.

"Everyone should respect police officers doing their lawful duties. No one is above the law," the police spokesperson stated.

Meanwhile, President of the Talakawas Rights Group, Comrade Kola Edokpayi, condemned the alleged assault, describing it as unacceptable.

In a statement, Edokpayi commended the officers involved for maintaining professionalism and restraint despite the provocation.

Why subsidy removal, FX reforms caused unavoidable economic shocks - Oyedele

The Minister of Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy, Taiwo Oyedele, has said the economic volatility that followed the removal of petrol subsidy and reforms in the foreign exchange market was unavoidable.

Oyedele stated this in an interview with The African Report weekend.

He said the reforms were necessary to address distortions created by years of fuel and foreign exchange subsidies.

"If you think about where we started, about three years ago, it was a situation where there was a lot of economic distortion, particularly

coming from fuel subsidy, FX subsidy and a lot of other market distortions," he said.

He noted that the government anticipated short-term consequences, including increases in fuel prices, transportation costs and inflationary pressures, as it implemented the reforms.

"You remove the subsidy, fuel prices would go up. Transportation is affected. Logistics is affected. Price pressure and inflation, right? So those things would happen," he added.

Oyedele said the administration believes the economy has largely moved beyond the initial adjustment

period and is now entering a new phase focused on growth.

He said recent economic indicators point to improving conditions, including moderation in inflation, greater stability in the foreign exchange market and gradual economic growth.

"We've seen moderation in inflation. We've seen the foreign exchange rate stabilise. We've also seen growth, modest growth, but increasing," he noted.

The minister acknowledged that recent geopolitical developments have created fresh economic pressures but maintained that the

government's priority is now to translate earlier reforms into tangible economic gains.

He said investments in power, infrastructure and skills development would be critical to sustaining growth, while reforms aimed at improving the business environment would continue.

Oyedele also spoke about ongoing efforts to strengthen tax compliance, saying the government is working towards a system that ensures compliance through enforcement mechanisms rather than relying solely on voluntary participation. (Premium Times)

Anambra state governor, Professor Chukwuma Soludo, has urged the Igbo nation to move away from agitation for Biafra and seek what he described as a structured intellectual interrogation of the "Igbo question" in Nigeria.

Soludo said the Igbo needs Nigerians just as Nigerians need the Igbo which encapsulates the need to jettison methods of past agitations, particularly the "sit-at-home" syndrome that persisted for five years and impacted negatively on the economy of

South-east states.

The governor made these remarks at the Light House in Awka following a compelling stage performance titled "The Tale

of Two Nnamdis," written by Tobe Osigwe and directed by Prof. Uche Nwaozuzu. The play was presented by students of the Theatre Arts and Film Department, University of Nigeria, Nsukka (UNN).

The governor, who expressed concern over the lack of structured intellectual engagement regarding the challenges facing the Igbo people and their position within the Nigerian

state, argued that there was a need to address what he termed a "dual personality" paradox regarding their participation in national politics.

He said, "I saw the war very clearly. My mother died during the war, and my father carried a bullet in his body for 11 years after the war. I am a Pan-Africanist and a proud Nigerian. Nd Igbo needs Nigerians, Nigerians need nd Igbo, same for the world. Our prosperity will accelerate if we take advantage of a wider space.

"It is true that Ndi Igbo wants the presidency, but the paradox has to be addressed. As a people,

where do we stand? How can you govern a people who don't know your stand? Any group that advances the conversation of the Igbo question in Nigeria will have our support. The beauty of our republican nature is that you cannot muscle your way through it, you must engage."

He added that while he respects diverse convictions, he remains a strong advocate for bargaining and civil discourse, citing the political legacy of Nnamdi Azikiwe, who according to him, "helped us bargain in the First and Second Republics. He taught us the politics of bargaining."

Without legal education reforms, we risk producing unprepared lawyers – Osigwe

President of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), Mazi Afam Osigwe, (SAN) has called for urgent reforms in Nigeria's legal education system, warning that the country risks producing lawyers unprepared for the realities of a rapidly changing world if decisive action is not taken.

Osigwe gave the charge while speaking at the 2026 NBA Legal Education Summit.

In a paper titled "Accelerating Legal Education Reform in Nigeria: Progress, Problems & Prospects," the NBA President challenged stakeholders in the legal profession to rethink the structure, content, and delivery of legal education in Nigeria.

Commending the NBA Legal Education Committee for convening regional town hall meetings and the summit, the NBA President stressed that legal education must go beyond theoretical instruction and evolve into a dynamic, practical, and technology-driven system capable of producing lawyers equipped for contemporary realities.

According to him, legal education is not a one-

time academic exercise but a continuous process that must adapt as society evolves. He noted that lawyers can only be as effective as the educational system that produced them, emphasizing that the quality of legal education directly impacts the justice delivery system and national development.

The NBA President lamented the declining practical exposure available to young lawyers, revealing that only a small percentage of newly called lawyers have the opportunity to undergo proper pupillage or mentorship before venturing into practice.

He observed that economic realities and technological advancements have made it possible for many young lawyers to commence practice with little or no structured professional guidance.

In a bold intervention, he questioned whether the current five-year duration for obtaining an LL.B degree remains necessary, arguing that emphasis should instead be placed on practical, focused, and competency-

based legal training. He endorsed proposals advocating a reduction in the duration of legal studies while prioritizing core legal subjects and professional skills development.

He further advocated the expansion of legal clinic education, moot

courts, workshops, and other participatory learning methods aimed at strengthening advocacy, analytical reasoning, and problem-solving skills among law students. He criticized excessive reliance on rote learning and urged institutions to cultivate

independent thinking and innovation.

The NBA President also proposed a future review of the Nigerian Law School's current in-campus model, citing the increasing number of law graduates, rising costs

of legal education, and admission limitations.

He suggested that technology-driven and virtual learning models may become inevitable in ensuring wider access to vocational legal training.

Case transfer: Supreme Court okays NIMASA's appeal against lower court judgement

The Supreme Court has okayed an appeal filed by the Nigerian Maritime Administration and Safety Agency (NIMASA) against a judgement of the Appeal Court transferring a case to the Federal High Court (FHC).

The Court of Appeal in Lagos, in its consequential order, had directed a Lagos State High Court to transfer a suit filed by two claimants against NIMASA and three others to the FHC for accelerated hearing and determination.

The appellate court held that the Lagos court had no jurisdiction to entertain the suit.

Dissatisfied with the appellate court judgment, NIMASA approached the Supreme Court for proper interpretation.

The regulatory agency named the claimants the Integrated Oil and Gas Ltd and its Chairman, Cap. Emmanuel Ihenacho (rtd.), a former Minister of Interior, as 1st and 2nd respondents in the appeal.

In its appellant's brief filed by Chief Emeka Ngige, SAN, NIMASA argued that Section 15 of Court of Appeal Act which the Appeal Court relied on was wrongly invoked as the trial Lagos State High Court lacked powers to transfer a matter to the Federal High Court.

The agency argued that there was no provision in the High Court law, which empowered the trial court to transfer cases in which it lacks jurisdiction to the Federal High Court.

It submitted that while FHC could make an order transferring a matter in which it lacked jurisdiction to a state high court based on Section 22(2) of the Federal High Court Act (as amended), the latter court cannot make the same order of transfer under Section 22(3) of the Act.

On their part, the 1st and 2nd respondents, represented by Emmanuel Ekpenyong Esq. of the law firm of Fred-Young & Evans LP, urged the apex court to determine whether the court below rightly invoked the provisions in contest.

Ekpenyong, who prayed the court to dismiss the appeal, inter alia, submitted that Section 15 of the Court of Appeal Act vests the court below with the power to make any order in ensuring matters are determined on their merit.

"The consequential order made by the Court of Appeal was pursuant to its powers under

Section 15 of its Act," he said. A five-panel member of the apex court, in a unanimous judgement delivered by Justice Moore Adumein, set aside the Appeal Court decision.

Although the apex court judgment was delivered on April 17, its certified true copy was sighted on Friday in Abuja.

The panel held that what the appellate court ought to have done was to strike out the suit, having found that the High Court of Lagos State had no jurisdiction to hear the suit.

The claimants; the Integrated Oil and Gas Ltd, and the ex-minister had filed the suit marked: LD/ADR/91/2013 at the Lagos State High Court.

They named NIMASA, Ziakade Patrick Akpobolokemi, Barrister Callistus Nwabueze Obi, and Hajia Lami Tumaka as 1st to 4th defendants respectively, and demanded N90 billion, N349 million in damages.

The claimants also sought an order of injunction compelling the defendants to publish a retraction and an apology on NIMASA's website, Guardian, Thisday and Punch Newspapers over the arrest of the former minister and allegations of oil theft and involvement in illegal oil dealings against the company.

But the defendants filed statements of defence and preliminary objections challenging the competence of the suit.

NIMASA, in its objection, argued that the suit ought to be struck out because the Lagos High Court lacked jurisdiction to entertain the suit, and it was an abuse of court process in the light of pendency of another suit, marked: FHC/L/1177/2012, at Federal High Court in Lagos.

But Justice S.B.A Candide-Johnson of the Lagos State High Court dismissed the objection.

Dissatisfied with the ruling, NIMASA approached a Lagos Court of Appeal challenging the ruling.

The appellate Court, in its judgment, held that the appeal was meritorious.

The panel allowed the appeal and set aside the ruling of the trial court.

The appellate court further ordered that the suit be transferred to the Federal High Court Lagos Division for assignment by the FHC Chief Judge for accelerated hearing and determination.

Court jails hotel employee for theft

An Egor Magistrate's Court in Benin has sentenced a 26-year-old man, Philip Reuben, to two months imprisonment for conspiracy and theft.

Reuben was convicted of stealing household items worth N660,000.

The Magistrate, Dorothy Adamaigbo, however, gave the convict an option of N20,000 fine.

She said that the conviction would serve as a deterrent to others.

Police prosecutor Evans Okunoghae had told the court that on May 3, 2026, at Ugbiyokho Quarters in Benin, the convict and other suspects, currently at large, conspired to commit the crime.

"On the said date, Reuben and others stole an air conditioner, iron rods, and cooking pots worth N660,000, belonging to Osaigbovo Eboigbe, the complainant," he told the court.

The prosecutor said the offences contravened Sections 412(2), and 294(7), of the Criminal Law of Edo State, 2022.

He said that local vigilantes arrested Reuben and handed him over to the Police. (NAN)

Withheld entitlements: 176 retired comptrollers sue minister, Immigration boss, others

About 176 former officials of the Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS), who retired on the rank of Comptroller of Immigration, have sued the Minister of Interior, the NIS' Comptroller General and four others, seeking to compel them pay their withheld entitlements.

Bothered by the failure of relevant authorities to act, the claimants in the suit, marked: NICN/ABJ/146/2026 filed for them before the National Industrial Court of Nigeria (NICN), Abuja by their lawyer, Maroof Giwa and led by Abalaka Betty Ajuma, alleged among others, that the NIS and other relevant bodies have failed to accord them their entitlements since they retired years ago.

Listed along with the Interior Minister and NIS' CG as defendants are the NIS, the Civil Defence, Correctional, Fire and Immigration Board (CDCFIS), the CDCFIS Chairman and the Attorney General of the Federation (AGF).

The claimants stated that by the condition of service of the NIS, published in a gazette released by the Federal Government in 2015 they were entitled to a car, domestic staff among others upon their retirement at the rank of Comptroller, entitlements that have allegedly been

denied them since they exited service honourably years ago.

They gave the name of the gazette as: "Unified and Reviewed Conditions of Service for the Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC), Federal Fire, Nigeria Immigration and Nigeria Prisons Services hereinafter referred to as "Conditions of Service, 2015."

The claimants stated that the gazette expressly provides that any officer of the NIS, who retires on the rank of Comptroller of Immigration shall be entitled to one official car and the services of five domestic staff on various salary levels.

The 176 aggrieved retirees, who said they satisfied all conditions for the enjoyment of the retirement entitlements, stated that "it is customary and obligatory on the defendants to give out cars to retiring personnel on the rank of Comptroller of Immigration and above."

They added that despite their retirement on the qualifying rank of Comptroller of Immigration, "the defendants have failed, refused, and neglected to provide them with the official cars or the monetary equivalents thereof."

The claimants stated that they retired at different years,

adding that upon retirement, they became immediately entitled to the benefits on retirement, stipulated in the gazetted condition of service of the NIS.

They said their decision to sue was informed by the alleged failure of the defendants to heed their demands contained in the many reminders and pre-action notices sent by their lawyers.

The claimants want the court to, among others, declare each of them is entitled to be provided with one car as benefits on retirement under the gazetted condition of service of 2015 having retired on the rank of Comptroller of Immigration.

They also seek a declaration that the defendant's alleged failure to provide them with the said entitlements as stipulated in the unified condition of service is unlawful, wrongful, and unconstitutional.

The aggrieved retirees want the court to issue an order directing the defendants to provide them with the entitlements or N15million each in the place of a physical car.

The case, now assigned to Justice Rakiya Haastrup for hearing, has been adjourned until June 23.

NNPC boosts Nigeria's fiscal strength as profit climbs to N481bn

The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited recorded a remarkable surge in revenue and profitability in April 2026, reflecting improved crude oil production, stronger operational performance, and growing contributions to government finances.

According to the company's April 2026 operational and financial report released on Saturday, revenue climbed sharply to N4.97 trillion in April from N2.77 trillion in March, representing a month-on-month increase of approximately 79 per cent.

The performance signals a strong start to the second quarter of the year as NNPC intensifies efforts to boost oil production, strengthen operational efficiency, and

accelerate strategic gas infrastructure projects aimed at supporting Nigeria's long-term energy security and industrial growth.

The company's improved financial position was also reflected in its bottom line, with profit after tax rising to N481 billion in April, compared with N276 billion recorded in March.

The substantial increase in earnings was supported by higher crude oil production levels and stronger operational output across key business segments.

Industry observers note that the latest figures underscore the impact of ongoing reforms and production recovery initiatives designed to improve the company's financial performance following its transition into a commercially oriented national energy company.

NNPC reported that production

increased to 1.68 million barrels per day in April, up from 1.56 million barrels per day in March.

The increase comes amid sustained efforts by the Federal Government and industry stakeholders to combat crude oil theft, pipeline vandalism, and illegal refining activities that have historically undermined Nigeria's production capacity.

The improved output is particularly significant as Nigeria continues its push to meet and potentially exceed production levels required under the framework of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries quota system.

Higher production levels are expected to support foreign exchange inflows, improve fiscal revenues, and strengthen investor confidence in Nigeria's oil and gas sector.

Between January and April 2026, the company remitted N3.71 trillion in statutory payments to the Federal Government, compared with N2.89 trillion recorded at the end of the first quarter.

The increase reflects stronger revenue generation and reinforces the strategic role of the national oil company in supporting government expenditure and economic development programmes.

Energy and financial analyst, Semiu Ajibade says the April performance provides encouraging evidence that NNPC's ongoing reforms and operational improvements are beginning to deliver measurable results.

He believes the progress recorded on the OB3 and AKK pipelines could ultimately prove more transformative than short-term oil revenue gains.

First HoldCo balances recapitalisation, shareholder returns as profits rise

Shareholders of First HoldCo Plc may be on course for a return to dividend earnings after the group's Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer, Wale Oyedeji, assured investors that dividend payments are expected to resume at the end of the current financial year.

Speaking during the company's 14th Annual General Meeting held virtually on Friday, Oyedeji said the group's impressive first-quarter performance and strengthening capital position have created a solid foundation for renewed shareholder returns.

According to him, shareholders can reasonably build their dividend expectations around the group's strong first-quarter results, provided the current momentum is sustained throughout the year.

"In terms of dividend expectations, you can build those expectations on our first quarter numbers, which are strong. We hope to sustain those numbers, and we believe dividend payments will resume at the end of this financial year," Oyedeji stated.

The First HoldCo chief explained that despite management's intention to pay a dividend of N1 per share, regulatory requirements introduced under the ongoing banking recapitalisation programme compelled the company to prioritise strengthening its capital base.

He noted that directives from the Central Bank of Nigeria required financial institutions to focus on capital adequacy across all operating subsidiaries before distributing earnings to shareholders.

To meet these obligations, First HoldCo is seeking shareholder approval to increase its share capital to N1 trillion, a move designed to ensure that all subsidiaries remain adequately capitalised and positioned for future growth.

According to Oyedeji, stronger capital buffers will ultimately pave the way for sustainable dividend payments backed by improved earnings performance.

The optimism surrounding dividend resumption is underpinned by First HoldCo's robust first-quarter 2026 financial results.

The group recorded a profit before tax of N321 billion in the first quarter of 2026, representing a remarkable 72 per cent increase from the N186.47 billion posted during the corresponding period in 2025.

The results mark what management describes as a significant recovery phase following recent capital strengthening initiatives undertaken across the group.

Oyedeji disclosed that the group's cost-to-income ratio improved significantly from approximately 53-54 per cent in 2025 to 45 per cent in 2026, indicating stronger cost management and better profitability.

According to him, the group's strategy is to evolve into a "financial supermarket" capable of generating multiple revenue streams while reducing dependence on traditional lending income.

He revealed that the bank now processes approximately 21 per cent of all deposit money bank transactions in the country.

Describing the scale of the operation, he noted that roughly one out of every five banking transactions in Nigeria passes through First Bank's digital infrastructure, underscoring the institution's growing importance in the country's financial services sector.

Earlier this year, First HoldCo announced that First Bank had successfully met the CBN's new minimum capital requirement of N500 billion.

The capital raise was achieved through a combination of market-based fundraising initiatives and internal balance-sheet restructuring measures.

The recapitalisation programme introduced by the Central Bank is aimed at strengthening the Nigerian banking sector, enhancing resilience against economic shocks, and increasing banks' capacity to support economic growth.

Nigeria spends \$2.34bn on food imports in 2025 - Report

The recent data released from Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) showed that Nigeria spent \$2.34 billion on food imports in 2025.

The figure represents a 7.37 per cent decline from the \$2.53 billion recorded in 2024, showing a moderation in food-related foreign exchange demand despite Nigeria's continued reliance on imported food products.

The share of food imports in total foreign exchange utilisation fell more sharply, dropping from 9.49 per cent in 2024 to 4.97 per cent in 2025.

The CBN quarterly statistical bulletin data also revealed that food imports consumed an average of \$195.28 million monthly in 2025.

Analysis of monthly utilisation indicated that \$213.11 million utilised in January, \$195.68 million in February, \$141.30 million in March and \$141.13 million in April.

It later rose to \$202.83 million in May before easing to \$171.08 million in June.

In the second half of the year, food import demand strengthened, rising to \$229.70 million in July, \$175.55 million in August and \$248.60 million in September, the highest monthly figure in 2025.

Food importers also utilised \$193.05 million in October, \$185.45 million in November and \$245.86 million in December.

Although food imports remained significant, the share of total foreign exchange utilisation declined by 4.52 percentage points, from 9.49 per cent in 2024 to 4.97 per cent in 2025, meaning that food imports took up a smaller portion of overall forex demand, even though the economy used more foreign exchange across sectors.

Total foreign exchange utilisation increased by \$20.52 billion, or 77 per cent, from \$26.65 billion in 2024 to \$47.17 billion in 2025.

By contrast, food import utilisation fell by \$186.40 million, from \$2.53 billion to \$2.34 billion.

Nigeria's forex reserves climb to \$49.34bn

Nigeria's official foreign reserves recorded another week of growth, reinforcing confidence in the country's external position amid improving foreign exchange market stability.

According to data released by the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), the nation's forex reserves increased by approximately \$359.84 million week-on-week to close at \$49.34 billion as of May 26, 2026, compared with \$48.98 billion recorded at the end of the previous week.

Analysts attributed the sustained reserve accretion to steady oil-related inflows and relatively stable crude oil production levels, which continue to support Nigeria's external liquidity buffer and strengthen investor confidence in the economy.

The continued improvement in reserves also comes amid ongoing reforms in the foreign exchange market aimed at enhancing liquidity and reducing volatility in the naira exchange rate.

Despite the positive trend, market watchers warned that downside risks remain, particularly from elevated foreign exchange demand pressures and the possibility of portfolio outflows triggered by uncertainties in the global financial environment.

Nigeria, Liberia strengthen regional maritime operations

"Nigeria has demonstrated genuine commitment to maritime partnership and regional growth. Liberia looks forward to deeper collaboration with NIMASA in maritime administration, safety, capacity development, and trade promotion for the advancement of Africa's Blue Economy," Akinosun said.

Nigerian equities gain N431bn despite weak market breath

Transactions on the floor of Nigerian Exchange (NGX) ended the week on a positive note, gaining N431 billion, supported by selective gains recorded across key major stocks.

The benchmark NGX All-Share Index (ASI) advanced by 673.10 basis points week-on-week to close at 250,385.47 points against 249,712.37 points recorded in the preceding week, while market capitalisation increased by approximately 0.27 per cent to N160.508 trillion from N160.077 trillion reported a week ago as the year-to-date return strengthened further to 60.90 per cent reflecting sustained, cautious, investor confidence in the domestic equities space.

The market breath remained weak, closing negative with 34 gainers against 51 decliners while 61 equities remained unchanged with their prices.

Trading activity was subdued over the review period, as key market indicators recorded notable declines. The number of deals, trading volume, and transaction value fell by 27.91 per cent, 38.17 per cent and 31.08 per cent week-on-week, respectively.

In total, investors exchanged 2.398 billion shares worth N111.480 billion across 241,313 deals, underscoring relatively weak participation and cautious positioning by market players. This is in contrast to a total of 3.875 billion shares valued at N161.757 billion that exchanged hands last week in 334,745 deals.

The Financial Services Industry led the activity chart in volume terms with 1.656 billion shares valued at N48.229 billion traded in 94,812 deals; thus contributing 69.07 per cent and 43.26 per cent to the total equity turnover volume and value respectively.

The Services Industry followed with 265.448 million shares worth N4.530 billion in 19,443 deals. Third place was the ICT Industry, with a turnover of 101.848 million shares worth N9.163 billion in 24,858 deals.

Trading in the top three equities, namely Fidelity Bank Plc, Access Holdings Plc and The Initiates Plc, accounted for 903.681 million shares worth N19.227 billion in 22,238 deals, contributing 37.69 per cent and 17.25 per cent to the total equity turnover volume and value respectively.

On the negative side, the banking, Consumer Goods, and Industrial Goods indices declined amid

sustained profit-taking activities and weak momentum in key heavyweight stocks.

The Banking sector emerged as the worst-performing segment, declining by 2.43 per cent W-o-W following heavy selloffs in Fidelity Bank Plc, Guaranty Trust Holding Company Plc, and Stanbic IBTC Holdings Plc.

Similarly, the Consumer Goods index weakened by 2.04 per cent as investors booked profits in Dangote Sugar Refinery Plc, Unilever Nigeria Plc, and Champion Breweries Plc.

The Insurance sector also came under pressure, falling by 1.77 per cent due to weakened investor appetite for Regency Alliance Insurance Plc, AIICO Insurance Plc, and Guinea Insurance Plc. Meanwhile, the Industrial Goods sector edged lower by 0.05 per cent following mild profit-taking in Chemical and Allied Products Plc, Premier Paints Plc, and Cutix Plc.

Tinubu's 3 years: Major economic indicators surge

First three years of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu witnessed mixed performance, with economic indicators buoyed by reforms.

But some key social indicators appear slow in responding to the reform introduced by the president.

For instance, Nigeria's Nominal GDP grew from approximately \$363.85 billion in 2023 to about \$377.36 billion by May 2026, while the Nigeria Exchange (NGX) surged from about N30 trillion in 2023 to N160 trillion by May 2026, an increase of over 633 per cent during the period.

In addition, Nigeria's foreign exchange (forex) reserves grew from \$33 billion in 2023 to \$49.37 billion in 2026.

Over this period, the size of the domestic economy increased by roughly \$13.51 billion, expanding consistently from a 2.74 per cent real GDP growth in 2023 to 3.89 per cent by the first quarter of 2026.

According to the Bureau of Statistic (NBS), full Year 2023 saw real GDP grow by 2.74 per cent, and the total nominal value stood at about \$363.85 billion.

The economy experienced tight fiscal conditions and slower annual growth before the impact of major national

economic reforms took root.

The NBS reported a first quarter real GDP growth rate of 3.89 per cent. The total economy is currently trending at an estimated nominal value of \$377.36 billion, heavily driven by the thriving non-oil and services sectors.

Services sector remains the largest and fastest-growing contributor, expanding from a baseline average of 56.55 per cent in 2023 to over 57.7 per cent by first quarter of 2026, driven largely by Information/Communication and Financial Services.

Agriculture & Industry sectors have shown measurable recovery. Agriculture alone recorded an improved growth of 3.15 per cent in first quarter of 2026, bouncing up from a much weaker 0.18 per cent recorded in previous years.

The Nigerian Exchange (NGX) market capitalisation also experienced explosive growth between 2023 and May 2026, surging from about N30 trillion to peak at over N160 trillion.

Analysts say the historic equity bull run was largely driven by foreign exchange reforms, massive institutional investor participation, and strong corporate earnings from the banking, oil, and gas sectors.

Market capitalisation started the year around N30 trillion. 2024: By the end of May, the total market valuation had risen to about N56.2 trillion, and the

Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) reported an overall growth to N123.9 trillion by early 2026.

Between January – April 2026, the market hit its historic stride, crossing the N100 trillion milestone in early January and swelling to N139.8 trillion by mid-April. By late May 2026, equities market capitalisation consistently hovered between N155 trillion and N160 trillion, driven by broad institutional participation following positive economic signals and sovereign rating upgrades.

Also, the Nigeria's foreign reserves have experienced a massive recovery between 2023 and May 2026, with gross reserves soaring from around \$33 billion at the end of 2023 to a 13-year high of \$50.45 billion in February 2026, before stabilising around \$49.37 billion by late May.

Net reserves similarly rebounded from a critically low \$3.99 billion in 2023 to over \$34.8 billion by late 2025. The trajectory of Nigeria's foreign reserves during this period is closely tied to the administration's economic reforms, including the removal of fuel subsidies and the unification of the exchange rate, which helped boost dollar inflows and investor confidence.

A breakdown of the reserves trajectory showed that in 2023, gross reserves closed the year at approximately \$33.22

billion, with net reserves lingering significantly lower at roughly \$3.99 billion. In 2024, external liquidity began to stabilise, with gross reserves climbing to about \$40.19 billion and net reserves reaching \$23.11 billion by year-end.

In 2025, the reserves continued its sustained upward momentum, driven by improved crude oil production and diaspora remittances, pushing gross reserves past the \$45 billion mark by December.

And by 2026, gross reserves peaked at \$50.45 billion in mid-February, marking a 13-year high. After a brief tightening in April due to debt servicing and forex market interventions, reserves rebounded strongly in May to hover around \$49.37 billion.

On the other hand, Nigeria's official unemployment rate ranged between 4.1% and 5.4% from 2023 to May 2026, according to the National Bureau of Statistics. The lowest rate during this period was (4.1% in early 2023, while it peaked at 5.4% in late 2023).

Analysts explain this sharp decline from previous years reflects a revised methodology adopted in 2023.

A breakdown of unemployment data showed that in first quarter of 2023: (4.1%), second quarter of 2023: (4.2%), third quarter of 2023: (5.0%), fourth quarter of 2023: (5.4%). In the first quarter of 2024, it stood at 5.3%, second quarter of 2024 (4.3%).

The Naira depreciated sharply in both official and parallel markets, moving from N464.67 per dollar in 2023 to hover around N1,373 by May 2026. This drastically reduced the affordability of imported food, electronics, and global apparel.

Retirees' entitlements receiving attention, NAMA MD assures

Musa said "Significantly, it was under Engr. Farouk's administration renewed administrative attention, institutional commitment and official approvals were secured towards addressing the outstanding obligations. Following engagements

with relevant stakeholders and retirees' representatives, the Managing Director immediately directed the appropriate departments to commence the necessary processes required for settlement."

Kostyuk beats four-time French Open winner Swiatek

Four-time champion Iga Swiatek was knocked out of the French Open on her 25th birthday, losing her fourth-round match in straight sets to in-form Marta Kostyuk.

Polish third seed Swiatek was plagued by inconsistencies as Ukrainian 15th seed Kostyuk won 7-5 6-1 on Court Philippe Chatrier.

Swiatek is nicknamed the "Queen of Clay" having won four titles at Roland Garros, but has not won a title on the surface since her most recent triumph in Paris in 2024.

The six-time Grand Slam champion, who will start the defence of her Wimbledon title at the end of June, is yet to win a tournament in 2026 and said in her post-match press conference that it "wasn't a good day in the office".

In contrast, Kostyuk entered the French Open undefeated on clay in 2026 having won titles at the Madrid Open earlier this month and the Rouen Open in April.

Kostyuk said: "I feel like I've given myself more space



to just create something, to challenge my opponents.

"The most important thing I've been doing this whole time is really just trying to enjoy it. I woke up in the morning and all I thought about was what an unbelievable day I have to live today, playing on Chatrier against Iga. There's nothing I could do today other than this."

Kostyuk will play fellow Ukrainian Elina Svitolina in the quarter-finals after the seventh seed's 4-6 6-4 6-0 win over Switzerland's Belinda Bencic.

There was little to separate the duo in the first set as they

twice traded breaks, before Kostyuk took control at the end.

The brilliance of Swiatek's strokeplay was on display when returning against Kostyuk but unforced errors hampered her serve as two double faults gave the Ukrainian the advantage before she won the opening set with a fine backhand winner.

Kostyuk had not taken a set off Swiatek in their three previous tour-level meetings and the 23-year-old's confidence grew as she tightened her grip on the match.

Her powerful groundstrokes continued to wear Swiatek down as she ran away with the second set to reach the last eight at Roland Garros for the first time, while it is the first time that Swiatek has failed to reach the quarter-final at the French Open since her debut in 2019.

Swiatek's defeat comes amid a spell of big names exiting the men's and women's draws at Roland Garros.

MotoGP leader Bezzecchi wins Italian Grand Prix

MotoGP championship leader Marco Bezzecchi fought through to beat Aprilia team-mate Jorge Martin and win the Italian Grand Prix at Mugello.

Bezzecchi won the opening three rounds of the year and returned to the top step in race seven to open up a 17-point lead over Martin in the standings.

The 27-year-old celebrated at the finish with fellow Italian and Formula 1 championship leader Kimi Antonelli.

Manufacturer Aprilia had never won their home race in the premier class but took an emotional one-two finish as Italian bikes dominated.

Spanish rider Martin, the 2024 championship winner, set a MotoGP speed record on Friday when his Aprilia clocked 229mph.

Ducati were third on Sunday with two-time champion Francesco Bagnaia.



Bagnaia was able to pass Bezzecchi and make a run for victory midway through the race, but Bezzecchi fought back to regain the lead.

Reigning champion Marc Marquez returned after surgery on his arm and foot and came home seventh for his first finish since

March.

The Spanish MotoGP legend is 102 points behind Bezzecchi in the standings.

His brother, Alex Marquez, and Johann Zarco both missed the Mugello race after heavy crashes at the Catalan GP two weeks ago.

Bentaleb back for Algeria as World Cup squad named

Algeria handed a recall to midfielder Nabil Bentaleb and included him in their squad for the World Cup as coach Vladimir Petkovic on Sunday unveiled his selection for the tournament in Canada, Mexico, and the United States.

Bentaleb, 31, has not played for the team since last October but has been recalled to a squad that also sees the return of key attackers Houssemaouar and Amine Gouiri, who missed the Africa Cup of Nations finals in Morocco at the turn of the year because of injury.

Bentaleb played at the 2014 World Cup in Brazil, where Algeria got past the first round, but



has had several periods of lengthy absence from the side.

"We know Bentaleb well; he has all the qualities as a person for the group too," Petkovic said. "He

has shown he's in form these last few months."

Algeria compete in Group J with holders Argentina, Austria, and Jordan.

briefs Inspired Wembanyama helps Spurs to NBA Finals

Victor Wembanyama scored 22 points as San Antonio Spurs beat defending champions the Oklahoma City Thunder 111-103 to reach the NBA Finals for the first time since 2014, where they will face the New York Knicks.

San Antonio coach Mitch Johnson had called on Wembanyama to score more than 20 points after a disappointing showing in game five.

An inspired 28-point haul by the 22-year-old Frenchman on Friday helped level the best-of-seven series at 3-3 and save his "childhood dream" - which is now within touching distance.

"Winning the Larry O'Brien [NBA championship trophy] is a childhood dream, and having a real shot



at it, having a tangible chance at winning it - it's a lifetime chance," said Wembanyama after reaching the Finals for the first time.

"You never know when it's gonna happen again. But the day we win it, speaking for myself, it's going to be an amazing day - the realisation of a dream.

"It's hard to put into words. It's almost like the meaning of my life."

The Spurs last won the NBA showpiece in 2014, while the Knicks will compete in the finals for the first time in 27 years.

The NBA Finals will begin on 3 June, with a possible game seven finale on 19 June.

GB's Thorpe & Tomblin win golds at World Cup

Great Britain continued their strong form at the Artistic Swimming World Cup to claim three gold medals in Pontevedra, Spain.

Olympic silver medallist Isabelle Thorpe, 25, and European champion Ranjuo Tomblin enjoyed a success in the fourth World Cup weekend of the season by first winning the mixed duet technical on Friday.

An outstanding display of power and precision secured a third victory in mixed duet events at World Cup meetings in 2026.

Tomblin, 20, who has



established himself as one of the best male artistic swimmers in the world, then added to his gold medal tally by winning the men's solo free on Saturday.

The pair followed that up with a strong performance to win the mixed duet free - their fourth gold of the season together - on Sunday, scoring 259.5159 points.

Serrano equals knockout record with Hanson victory



Amanda Serrano equalled the record for the most knockouts in women's boxing history with a second-round stoppage of Cheyenne Hanson in Texas to retain her WBA and WBO featherweight titles.

The American dominated the encounter and, having pinned Germany's Hanson, 28, in the corner, unloaded a flurry of

unanswered punches that lead to the fight being waved off in El Paso, Texas.

The 37-year-old, who now has 32 wins by knockout - tying with women's boxing pioneer Christy Martin - was the first fighter to stop Hanson inside the distance.

In the co-main event, former UFC star Holly Holm was again

narrowly defeated by Stephanie Han to miss out on claiming the WBA lightweight title.

One judge scored it even at 95-95, but the other two saw it 96-94 for the undefeated champion.

Prior to the fight, Holm said she wanted to make a statement and then challenge Taylor in Ireland, but instead it was Han who called for that fight.
